Tour Historic Bulloch Hall (c. 1839). Mittie Bulloch grew up at Bulloch Hall and married Theodore Roosevelt, Sr. here in 1853. Their son, Teddy, became President of the United States. The house is furnished to represent the period of time when it was occupied by the Bulloch family and has an Open Hearth Kitchen and Museum Room. The grounds include a demonstration garden, reconstructed slave cabin and nature trail.

Tour Historic Barrington Hall (c. 1842), home of Barrington King. He was a successful and influential man who along with his father, Roswell King, co-founded the colony that would become Roswell. Barrington Hall is furnished with many original family possessions, and the surrounding six acres of original grounds look much as they did 160 years ago. The history of Barrington Hall is directly linked to the Roswell Manufacturing Company that owned and operated the mills in Roswell. The mills were among the leading suppliers of goods to the Confederacy.

Shop the antique, art galleries and specialty stores in Roswell's Historic District with lunch at a sidewalk café or restaurant. Recognized as a "foodie" destination, Roswell has dozens of restaurants for every taste—barbeque and bistro, tapas and Thai, down-home Southern cooking and continental cuisine. *(Prices vary, can be determined upon selection)*

2:30 – 3:30 p.m.

Tour Smith Plantation Home (c. 1845). This plantation plain style home and its ten original outbuildings sit on a large wooded site that was once part of a 300-acre cotton farm. Full of original furnishings and thousands of original artifacts, the home tells the story of three generations of this affluent family. Explore woodland trails, a spring house, cook house, and exhibits in the barn.
