



Mansions, Magnolias and Mistletoe Day Tour

- 10:00 a.m. – 10:45 a.m. Tour Historic Bulloch Hall (c. 1839). Mittie Bulloch grew up at Bulloch Hall and married Theodore Roosevelt, Sr. here in 1853. Their son, Teddy, became President of the United States. The house will be decorated for the holidays with an emphasis on the life of President Theodore Roosevelt. The grounds include a demonstration garden, reconstructed slave cabin and nature trail. Tours are self-guided. (*\$8 per person; \$7 per person for seniors and groups of 20 or more*)
- 11:00 a.m. – 11:45 a.m. Tour Historic Barrington Hall (c. 1842), home of Barrington King. He was a successful and influential man who along with his father, Roswell King, co-founded the colony that would become Roswell. Barrington Hall is furnished with many original family possessions, and the surrounding six acres of original grounds look much as they did 160 years ago. Barrington Hall is decorated for the holidays with the theme, *Here Comes Santa Claus*. Enjoy visiting and exploring the changes in Santa's image over the years. (*\$8 per person; \$7 per person for seniors and groups of 20 or more*)
- 12:00 – 2:15 p.m. Shop the antique, art galleries and specialty stores in Roswell's Historic District with lunch at a sidewalk café or restaurant. Recognized as a "foodie" destination, Roswell has dozens of restaurants for every taste—barbeque and bistro, tapas and Thai, down-home Southern cooking and continental cuisine. (*Prices vary, can be determined upon selection*)
- 2:30 – 3:15 p.m. Tour Smith Plantation Home (c. 1845). This plantation plain style home and its ten original outbuildings sit on a large wooded site that was once part of a 300-acre cotton farm. Full of original furnishings and thousands of original artifacts, the home tells the story of three generations of this affluent family. Images of Christmas include reminders of Christmas traditions from years-gone-by. Guests will see exquisite floral displays throughout the house. Mantels will be designed using magnolia leaves since both heirloom magnolias and hydrangeas are found

on the property. Elegant and unique trees are decorated using berries, cotton balls, candles, musical notes and more. Downstairs will represent the c.1845 through the 1940's era. Upstairs will be elegantly decorated from the 1950's to the current year. (*\$8 per person; \$7 per person for seniors and groups of 20 or more*)
